RESOLUTION NO. 2023-04-IC

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING NEW YORK STATE SENATE BILL S.2862 AUTHORIZING MUNICIPALITIES TO OFFER REAL PROPERTY TAX CREDITS TO CERTAIN VOLUNTEERS WHO LIVE IN ONE MUNICIPALITY BUT WHO SERVE IN NEIGHBORING MUNICIPALITIES

WHEREAS, Inter-County Association of Western New York is made up of rural upstate counties with large geographic areas which are dependent upon fully-staffed and trained volunteers for fire protection and emergency ambulance services; and

WHEREAS, it is cost-prohibitive for Counties of Western New York with many small municipal governments to establish paid fire departments and employ professional firefighters and ambulance workers in order to meet the community's fire and emergency medical needs; and

WHEREAS, it has become increasingly difficult in recent years to recruit, train and retain volunteers in sufficient numbers to meet the fire and ambulance service needs of our community; and

WHEREAS, without a sufficient number of volunteer fire companies disbursed among a wide geographic area, and without each having a sufficient number of volunteers to respond to emergencies, the residents, property and insurance rates are be adversely impacted; and


WHEREAS, providing incentives to encourage able-bodied men and women to become and to decide to remain as active volunteer firefighters and ambulance workers is vitally important to the safety of persons and property throughout the Counties of Western New York; and

WHEREAS, New York State Senate Bill S.2862 would authorize municipalities to offer real property tax credits to volunteer firefighters and ambulance workers that live in neighboring counties; and

WHEREAS, New York State Senate Bill S.2862 would improve the pool of potential volunteers who would be incentivized to volunteer with volunteer fire departments, and would therefore have a tangible positive impact on the provision of emergency services; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED that the Inter-County Association of Western New York does hereby support New York State Senate Bill S.2862, an Act to amend the real property tax law in relation to volunteer firefighter and volunteer ambulance workers by adding a new section 466-1 to read as follows: Extension of benefits. Any governing body of a city, village, town, county, or school district that has provided a real property tax credit to volunteer firefighters and volunteer ambulance workers serving the municipality in which they reside, notwithstanding any provision of this title to the contrary, is hereby authorized to extend such real property tax credit to any volunteer services to a neighboring city, village, town, county or school district.
