PAPER



How to prepare: Keep dry

Not accepted: Wax coated containers, tissue paper, hardcover books. **No plastic or brown (cardboard) bags!**

CARDBOARD



Accepted: Corrugated cardboard, cereal boxes, clean pizza boxes, brown paper bags

Not accepted: Wax coated containers, tissue paper, hardcover books

PLASTIC



#1 Plastic



#2 Plastic

Accepted: #1 and #2 plastic containers, including *wide mouth containers (clamshells)* **Must be separated**

How to prepare: Clean. Labels do not need to be removed. **Leave lids on!** Crush to save space. **No plastic bags!**

Tires

Passenger vehicle tire - \$3.00 each

Truck and tractor tire - \$300/ton

No RIMS



METAL



Metal Food Cans

How to prepare: Clean. Labels do not need to be removed.

Not accepted: Aluminum beverage cans, aerosol, paint or fuel cans.

Scrap Metal / Appliances

NO CHARGE - Major appliances, Scrap metal accepted include: Stoves, washer, dryers, hot water tanks, furnaces and miscellaneous scrap metal. Residents may use any solid waste facility. Commercial Haulers and/or loads larger than a pickup truck must go to Bath Landfill.

**Car Batteries can be returned to any battery retailer, or your local scrap yard.*

GLASS



CLEAR, GREEN + AMBER GLASS

How to prepare: Clean. Remove and discard metal rings and lids. Labels do not need to be removed.

All glass may be mixed

Not accepted: Pyrex, window glass, ceramics, light bulbs, auto glass, etc.

Fluorescent Bulbs

Accepted at each site for recycling.



Residents ONLY.

It is illegal to put fluorescent bulbs in with trash.



Electronics Recycling

NO CHARGE

Accepted - Most anything with a cord or a battery. Ask if you're not sure.

Not Accepted - batteries, smoke detectors, broken CRTs
